The Postdoctoral Fellowships support young researchers in particular by giving them the opportunity to work on a chosen research project in a high-level research institution in an EU member state, associated country or a third country for one or two years.

The second part of this workshop will deal with the Starting and Consolidator Grant Schemes of the European Research Council (ERC). Starting and Consolidator Grants are aimed at promising researchers who are at the beginning of an independent research career.
