## Arriving with Public Transport

Train from the main station (Hauptbahnhof): Take the underground, route U4 (Seckbacher Landstraße direction) or U5 (Preungesheim direction) and leave at the next stop (Willy-Brandt-Platz). From there, take the route U1, U2, U3 or U8 (note: all directions but the Südbahnhof direction) and get off the train at Holzhausenstraße/Uni Campus Westend. From there it's a 5-minute walk to the campus.

Alternatively, you can take the 's-train' route S 1-9 from the main station (Hauptbahnhof) to Hauptwache and change to the underground route U1, U2, U3, or U8 (all directions but the Südbahnhof direction).

Bus: From the main station (Hauptbahnhof Südseite): Take the bus line 64 (Ginnheim direction) to Bremer Straße or Bremer Platz.

From the city center: Take the bus line 36 (Westbahnhof direction) to Uni Campus Westend (in front of Poelzig-Bau).

Taxi: The address of Campus Westend is Norbert-Wollheim-Platz 1.

In June 2016, voters in Great Britain and Northern Ireland have decided that the United Kingdom should leave the European Union. As a result of this referendum, the withdrawal procedure was initiated in accordance with Art. 50 TEU. According to current information, the so called 'Brexit' is scheduled to happen on Friday 29 March 2019. The XVII.
