Objective

To gain an understanding of how to compose, write, and publish a readable and citable scientific paper in international peer reviewed journals.

Description

The course is a step-by-step guide to writing and publishing a good scientific paper. It covers the reasons for publishing, choice of journal, appreciation of audience, ethical issues, and interacting with co-authors.

It discusses the planning, execution and structure of a scientific paper, including the presentation of figures and tables.

The course then goes systematically through the different sections of a paper discussing their purpose, content and grammar.

Thereafter, the course deals with the process of submission, communicating with editors, responding to referees' comments and correcting proofs.

Also covered are copyright problems, preprints, open access and making the most of your publication.

There will be opportunities to discuss the manuscripts being prepared by course participants.
