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Objective

This one-day workshop will present the key elements required for planning and preparing a research application after the completion of a doctorate. The development and presentation of a short outline will provide practice-oriented knowledge necessary for future research applications. The participants need no prior experience in applying for third-party funding.

Description

A successful academic career includes the acquisition of third-party funding as a main applicant from research organizations such as the DFG.

This workshop offers information on the theoretical part of such an application - from planning to submission!

- Find the right funding scheme for your career phase and acquaint yourself with the specific requirements (examples will be provided).
- Planning a convincing research application for your career development: How important are clear career goals?
- How important is it to be the main applicant, and why?
 - 4-step model
- Which key elements make up a successful application strategy?
- Project: What is a good research question?
- What is particularly important in the review process - Tips & Tricks?
- Writing the application: the most important elements and documents needed for a convincing project design and application (including schedule and budget); wording in the application: Do's & Don'ts

Methodology

- Practical part I: Cross-check career status
- Practical part II: Working on an outline
- Oral presentations by participants, discussion within the group, feedback from the trainer
