

## “The University and the City”

### Democratic Innovations: Engaging citizens in politics

The intent of democratic governance and the essence of Democratic Innovations are succinctly summarised in Abraham Lincoln’s 1863 Gettysburg Address: “Government of the people, by the people, for the people.” The goal of this conference is to share local experience including active citizens’ participation into political decision-making processes with sister cities of Frankfurt am Main. Thus, we hope to initiate an international dialogue on how to innovate democratic practices and institutions such that government truly is “of the people, by the people, for the people.”

We will focus on two key questions:

1. How does local democracy work in sister cities of Frankfurt am Main?
2. What are successful models to involve citizens in political decision-making processes in times of serious challenges to representative democracy through a fractalisation of political camps, a decreasing sense of allegiance to political parties, and simultaneously increasing demands for direct participation?

The conference will provide a basis to engage political practitioners with academia in a discourse about the future structure and practices of democracy.
