Professorship (W2) for Old Norse Literature and Culture

The professorship includes teaching and research in the field of Old Norse Studies. The focus lies on literature and cultural studies. Candidates are expected to apply for third party funding as well as to participate in the development of degree programs and in the activities of university committees. Experience with interdisciplinary and international cooperation as well as administrative tasks would be an asset.

Educational skills, an outstanding doctorate or an equivalent qualification as well as scholarly achievements in the form of a 'habilitation' or a junior professorship or its equivalent (such as an assistant professorship) are required.

The designated salary for the position is based on the German university pay scale or equivalent. Goethe University is an equal opportunity employer, committed to diversity and inclusion. In particular, we are welcoming applications by qualified women and people with a migrant background. At Goethe University, a special emphasis is placed on creating and sustaining a family-friendly work and research environment. Where applicants are otherwise equally qualified, preference is given to candidates with disabilities or equivalent. The same applies to women in fields in which they are under-represented.
