Troubling Testimonies: Women's Narrative of War

This lecture addresses women's testimonies that collectively have played a key role in producing new knowledge about gendered experiences of war and its aftermath. It analyzes a rich corpus of women's testimonies from four seminal conflicts: testimonies of the genocide in Rwanda (1994), testimonies pertaining to wartime rape in Bosnia-Herzegovina (1992-1995), the civil war in Sri Lanka (1983-2009), and testimonies of the violence perpetrated by the Islamic State (ISIS) in northern Iraq (2014). The testimonies have emerged over the years in a multitude of modes and sites, and when we bring them together, we see how testifying is a gendered, agential practice: the women exercise what can be termed narrative agency. How do women witnesses use their narrative agency to contribute to transitional justice, peacebuilding and societal transformation?
