Lot's Wife – Late Antique Paradigms of Sense and the Inner Chronology of the

Qur'an

The nameless wife of Lot appears as a rather marginal figure in the Qur'an. Her fate is addressed in different ways within the context of the destruction of Lot's people. A chronological and literary analysis of relevant passages shows that this figure, although deallegorized, is increasingly charged with meaning by the Prophet and the interpreting community forming around him. In the course of this process, Lot's wife develops into a prototypical sinner. This development points to an intensifying negotiation of sense paradigms, circumscribed by a historical debate about the meaning of words, in which Alexandrian and Antiochene exegetes were engaged for example. A chronological perspective on the Qur'an allows for understanding how a new hermeneutic evolved in response to the thought world of earlier traditions.
