Religion and History in the Education System:

A Practice Oriented Reform Project in Tunisia



The focus of this workshop is the comprehensive school reform project in Tunisia which was initiated in the 1990s by the former Tunisian Education Minister, Mohammed Charfi. As part of Charfi's project and in collaboration with his advisor, Moncef ben Abdeljelil, then a young researcher and today professor and Dean of the University for Cultural Sciences in Sousse, a new curriculum for schools was developed in which social studies formed the basis for learning goals and content. In this way, the project initiators hoped to promote young people's potential and to realize future-oriented reform visions. The workshop deals with the resulting changes and effects of the programme, as well as with the new teaching methods in the subjects "Religious Instruction" (lecture by Prof. M. b. Abdeljelil) and "History" (lecture by Dr. Achim Rohde).
