

German Intermediate Course - B1-2

Objective

To achieve language level B1, the intermediate level of proficiency according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEF). The aim of this learning stage is the ability to express oneself in a limited way in familiar situations and to deal in a general way with non-routine information.

Description

This is the **second part** of the course B1, which we offer in two modules: B1-1 and B1-2. After the completion of **both modules**, i.e. the full B1 course, you will be able to:

- Understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered at work, in school, leisure, etc.
- Deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken
- Produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest and describe experiences, events, dreams, hopes & ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans
- Use basic grammatical structures.: e.g. past tense, reflexive verbs and subordinate clauses

The textbook that will be used in the course will be announced in the first lesson.

At the end of the course, participants who participated in 80% of the course will receive a certificate of completion.

We will inform you in a timely manner whether the course will take place online or at Campus Riedberg.

Conditions

- Pre-requisite for this workshop is the successful participation in the B1-1 level course.
- Participants of GRADE's B1-1 courses will be given priority at registration.
- Registration is binding. The costs of 25,00 EUR have to be paid prior to the course and will not be reimbursed.
